

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SANLIURFA HIGHLIGHTS




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Sanliurfa is considered the forth religious city after Mecca, Medina and Jerusalem for here is where Prophet Abraham the common ancestor of the three monotheistic religions was born and lived. According to the legend, Prophet Abraham was born in Sanliurfa and he was thrown into fire because of his fight with the idols worshipped by Nemrut and his society. It is believed God turned the fire into water and the burning coals into fish.



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Balikli Gol, the pools with holy carp and trout is situated at the center of the city. Sanliurfa known in the ancient times as Ur then as Edessa, is a fascinating city with a history of 13,500 years, which was enriched by different civilizations like Summer, Akkad, Babylon, Hittite, Arami, Assyrian, Persian, Roman, Macedonian and Byzantine.



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The Ataturk dam on Euphrates is the biggest dam in the Middle East and the 6th largest dam in the world. Built both to generate electricity and to irrigate the plains in the region, its construction began in 1983 and was completed in 1990. The dam embankment is 169 meters high and 1,820 meters long. The hydroelectric power plant has a total installed power capacity of 2,400 MW generating 8,900 GWh electricity annually.
